The programme is a collaboration with the National Autism Society of Malaysia (NASOM) at its Klang branch centre situated in Teluk Pulai.

Established in 1987, NASOM is based in Ara Damansara and employs a total of 150 staff, to run its 15 branch centres that are placed around the nation to bring light to the autism landscape. It also serves as a sanctuary to protect autism afflicted individuals while serving as a one stop centre in promoting treatment, education, welfare and acceptance of people with autism, amongst the public.

The half day programme bore witness to the children's mirth and joy as they played mini games and were treated to a sumptuous meal. CGC contributed to the home, in championing their noble cause.
